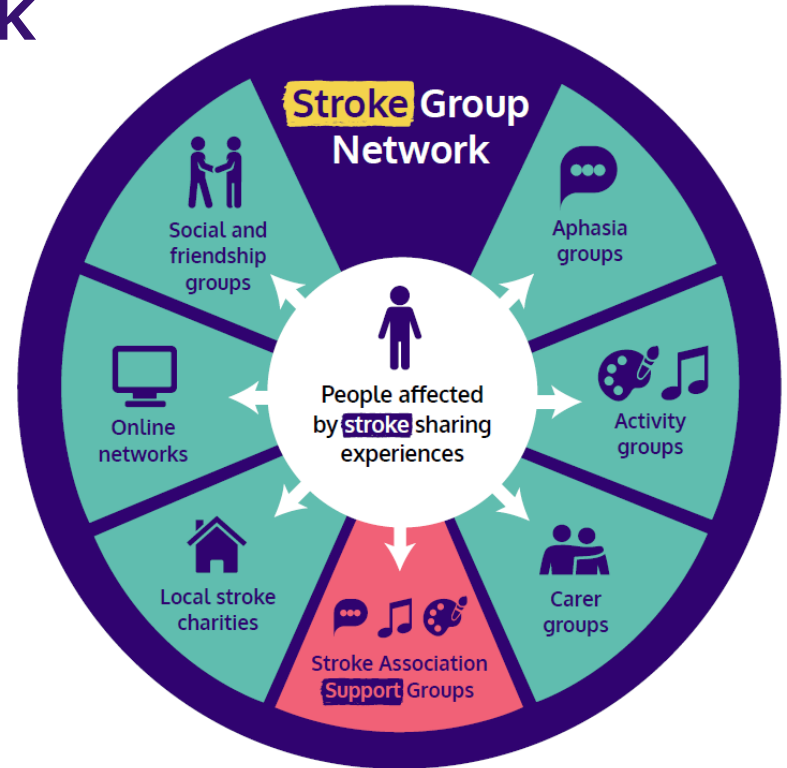

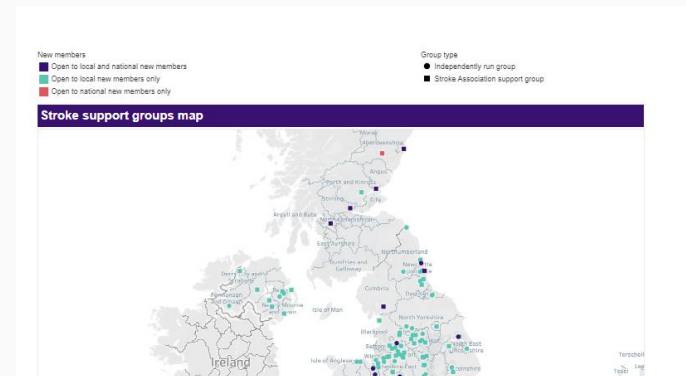
Our Stroke Group Network

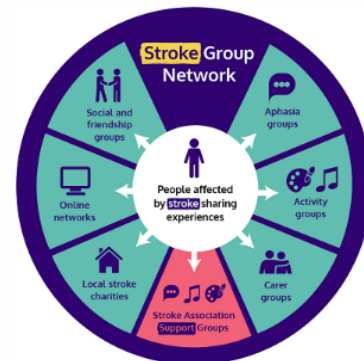

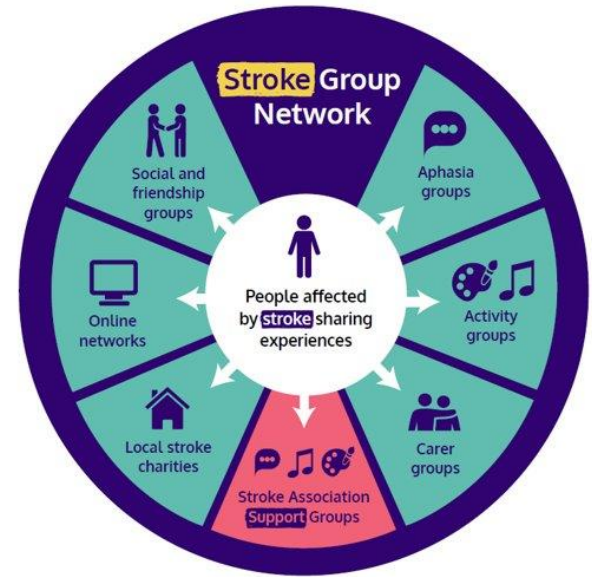
