

Fundraising ideas for **children**



Read – a – Thon -

Encourage young people to read and raise donations through the process.

Incorporate pledge fundraising methods in a month-long reading challenge, tasking the kids with reading as many books as they can for the duration of the fundraiser. These participants collect pledged donations corresponding to the number of books they read throughout the month. The more books they read, the more donations they raise!



Gift Wrapping Services -

Festive gift wrapping service or stall in exchange for donations.

This fundraising idea for kids doesn't require much: just wrapping paper, tape, scissors, and ribbons and bows.



Themed Bake Sale -

Host a themed bake sale. Bake sales work great for fundraising ideas for kids.

Brainstorm themes that relate to why you're raising money!



Art attack -

Run an art competition at your local school, youth group, and church or sports club, with any arts and crafts. Base it around a fun theme to get more kids involved.



Donations instead of presents -

Ask relatives and friends to donate to a charity of your child's choice instead of giving them presents for their birthday and Christmas.



Balloon Raffle -

All you need for this fundraiser are a pack of balloons, raffle tickets, and a prize. Place raffle tickets inside the balloons before you blow them up.

Supporters can pay to pop a balloon and collect the raffle ticket. The person with the winning raffle ticket gets the prize. It's that easy!

Straw Draw Fundraiser -

A straw draw is a simple and inexpensive fundraising idea that is perfect for clubs and sports teams. All you'll need is a pack of straws and a few small prizes.

Write down different perks on a piece of paper and attach one to every straw. Place the straws in a container and charge to pick a straw.



Olympic Games -

Get your kids to enjoy the outdoors and raise money at the same time.

Plan a field day with plenty of competitions and sports games for children of all ages. Spread the word about your event via social media, and invite the whole community to attend.

Charge a registration fee for teams and individuals to participate, and make sure you have a little prize for all the winners.



Walk to School

Challenge yourself to walk to school every day, and ask for sponsorship from family and friends.



Unwanted Sale

Gather your unwanted toys and books and have a table top sale



Treasure Hunt

A hunt is a fun fundraising idea for kids that can get entire families involved. Best of all, planning and hosting a hunt isn't difficult.

The first step is to map out your course and clues. Adjust the level of difficulty depending on the age group of the kids participating.

Next, you'll need to procure prizes. Keep your costs low by asking friends and local businesses to donate a prize for your event.



Variety Show

Give pupils and teachers a chance to showcase their talents, and raise money by selling tickets to the show.
