What is the research?



We want to **invite** you to take part in some research

This research is about helping **people** with **communication difficulties** to make **decisions**



The research involves a new communication test



Hospital staff will use the test



The test shows staff how to help people with communication difficulties to make decisions





We need to **check** if the **test** gives **correct** results



Before you decide it is **important** for you to **understand**

- why we are doing the research
- what happens during the research



Talk to friends and family about the research if you wish



Ask if you do not understand



Ask if you would like more information

Take time to decide if you wish to take part

Why are we doing the research?




People with **communication difficulties** may need **help** to **make decisions**



Some **healthcare staff don't know** how to **help**



We have developed a new **communication** test





We don't know if the test works

We don't know if staff know how to use the test

The research will give us these answers

What will I have to do?




Researchers will visit you at home or a place you choose



A researcher will talk to you about the research and show you information about it



This will help you to make a decision about taking part





you will need to **sign a consent form**This says that **you understand** the research and **you agree** to take part



If you cannot make a decision -

the researcher will ask your friend or relative if they think you would like to take part



If you decide to take part -

Researchers will visit you three times over two weeks



Each visit will take up to 30 minutes.



Visit 1

A researcher will ask you to do the communication test

The test asks you to listen, speak, read, write and follow short instructions



The researcher will make a video of you doing the test

Speech and language therapists will watch the video later



Visit 2

The researcher will ask you to do the test again



Visit 3

A different researcher will ask you to do some different communication tests

Will I get paid ?



You will **not get paid** for taking part in the research

Do I have to take part?

yes? no?	You can decide
	You don't have to
	If you don't take part you will still get your normal help
	If you change your mind, you can stop at any time
	You don't have to give a reason
	If you stop you will still get your normal help
yes? no?	You don't have to decide now, you can think about it
	You can take your time

You may find it interesting



What might be difficult about taking part?

	You may find the communication tests difficult You may find it tiring
Decombor 1	It will take up your time

Who will see the information about me?

	We need to collect some information about you
	We will keep the information about you safe
	Only we will see your information
	At the end of the research, we will destroy the video securely
John Smith	When we write reports, we will take out your name and personal details
	We will tell your doctor that you are doing this research

What will happen to the results?

	We will give you the results of the research
	We will share the results
	with other researchers
J.Smith	at conferences and meetings
	through newsletters and magazines
	in academic journals
	on the project website
	with other people who have a stroke
Jsmith	The results will not use your name

Is the research safe?



A committee decides if research can happen

This is the ethics committee

London - Brighton and Sussex Research

Ethics Committee has looked at this
research



They say

- this research can happen
- it is safe
- it has been planned properly



What if something goes wrong?

This is very unlikely

If something goes wrong

and you are **harmed** during the **research**

there is no compensation

If you are **harmed** because of **negligence**

you could make a legal claim

for compensation from

You may have to pay your legal costs

You can still complain to the NHS
